



Después de reflexionar un poco más, me parece que hemos invertido la intención del Adviento. Durante las últimas cuatro semanas viendo esta temporada sagrada de una manera, he cambiado de opinión.

Juntos hemos estado orando “¡Ven, Señor Jesús!” con gozosa expectación y esperanza, lo cual sin duda es algo bueno. ¿Qué tal ver el Adviento desde otra perspectiva en esta última semana?

El evangelio de hoy presenta la sagrada virtud de la hospitalidad. La hospitalidad es una gracia única de nuestro espíritu. Cuando otras personas están a nuestro alrededor, se sienten bienvenidas y aceptadas en el espacio del corazón que creamos para ellas. El destacado psicólogo Abraham Maslow lo llama "la consideración positiva e incondicional por los demás". Los Hospitalarios nunca ponen rígidos emocionalmente a los demás. Nunca son quisquillosos, hipersensibles o irritables, ni están aislados de los demás... otra cara de "El amor es paciente, el amor es bondadoso".

Morning, Church!

After some more reflection, seems to me we have Advent's intent reversed. For the last four weeks of seeing this sacred season in one way, I've changed my mind.

Together we've been praying "Come, Lord Jesus!" with joyous expectation and hope, which is a good thing to do, for sure. How about seeing Advent from another perspective in this last week?

In this stillness of morning prayer, I had an Annunciation of my own which spoke to my heart as an invitation to reverse past thinking and spiritual practice: It struck me that the Advent season is our time to *Go to Jesus*.

Even if these past four weeks rushed past you and you've yet to take the time for prayer and quiet reflection...*Go to Jesus*...even if you've delayed reaching out to someone who seeks your forgiveness...*Go to Jesus*...even if you have not had the humility to seek another's forgiveness...*Go to Jesus*...Today is another opportunity for you to do so. Jesus has *already* come to you ~ to all of us ~ now is our time to *Go to Jesus*.



Today's gospel features the sacred virtue of hospitality. Hospitality is a unique graciousness of our spirit. When others are around us they feel welcomed and accepted in the heart space we create for them. The noted psychologist, Abraham Maslow calls it, "the unconditional, positive regard for others." The Hospitable do not ever emotionally stiff arm others. They are never prickly, hypersensitive, or irritable, nor are they walled off from others...another face of "Love is patient, love is kind."

Hospitality births life in others. A welcoming spirit invites others to be themselves around us, to be at home with us and for us to truly be with them. Both Mary and Elizabeth experienced and shared Divine Hospitality.

God sent Gabriel to announce the births of their sons, Jesus and John. Both Mary and Elizabeth welcomed God's messenger and message. Through the hospitality of their hearts and bodies they served as midwives to the fulfillment of God's promise.

As you move through the comings and goings of these days, take every opportunity to be God's welcoming presence. Make room for Jesus and others in your heart.


