



Morning, Church!

Christmas decor is replaced by the Baptismal Font and Paschal Candle. We are in a new Liturgical season. Ordinary Time begins today with the celebration of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord.

Many consider Baptism a Sacrament of Infancy, a family celebration long past. This couldn't be further from the truth. Baptism is not a Sacrament of Infancy. It is the Sacrament of your lifelong faithjourney. As "the door to the sacred", Baptism consecrates and missions you in the Name of Jesus to proclaim God's saving presence among us as priest, prophet and leader /king.

In the Old Testament those chosen as leaders in community were bathed in oil. Anointing leaders served as sign of consecration. The anointing signified God's presence. God empowered the anointed one to lead by example, to be a reminder of God's call to faithfulness and holiness.

At your Baptism, you were anointed on the crown of the head with chrism, with this prayer, "God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ has freed you from sin and given you a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit. Now God anoints with the chrism of salvation. As Christ was anointed Priest, *Prophet*, and King, so may you live always as a member of His body, sharing everlasting life. Amen."

Biblical prophets were chosen to speak for God, to point out injustices and to serve as advocates for the poor and vulnerable. It's timely that this feast comes in the same week as the grotesque January 6 anniversary of the Insurrection on our Capitor and our democracy. The Insurrection's assault is not just on a building. It is an assault on our moral values, and our democracy's foundational underpinnings. Those anointed at Baptism, the Children of the Light, need stand up and speak up over and against this perpetuated Darkness and Lies and say, "Enough!"

Believers need act *as one* to uphold the truth of who we are and whose we are as a nation before *all of us* to drown in our apathetic silence. Baptism's sacred anointing designates you to preach The Word whether convenient or inconvenient, to name and condemn the overwhelming injustices in our midst, and to refuse to accept The Darkness and The Lies.

Historically, true prophets become martyrs for doing what God called them to do ~ including Jesus. Serving as God's prophet and truly living your Baptism is very risky. When you speak in God's Name, call others to conversion, to right injustices, and to care for the vulnerable, you are judged, mocked, hated and condemned.

Baptism is *not* the Sacrament of Infancy, it is the Sacrament of Committed Christians, Way Walkers, Children of the Light who strive to follow Jesus.

Among God's anointed prophets, you are in good company.
